CONTEXT

Coolum has 3 recreation parks that work together to provide the open space needs for the community. Each park is different in character and function.

Tickle Park is Coolum's premier park and has active recreation infrastructure including the playground, skate park, barbeques and amenities. The park hosts large community events and festivals on special occasions.

Jack Morgan Park and Lions/Norrie Job Park are being upgraded to try and take some of the pressure off Tickle Park.

Jack Morgan Park will be Coolum's cultural / civic heart. It is anticipated that, over time, the park will host small-scale community events such as concerts, outdoor movies, craft markets, outdoor art / sculpture exhibitions and children's holiday activities (through existing on-site community facilities). Jack Morgan Park will continue to be upgraded over the next few years.

Lions/Norrie Job Park will be maintained as a low-key passive recreation park with exercise trails and a natural and informal character. The park is scheduled to be upgraded from 2018 pending funding.
