Notice to residents and businesses Seawall, boardwalk & amenities building

Mid-November to early December 2020, weather and site conditions permitting

We would like to thank you for your understanding and patience as we deliver this essential upgrade for the future benefit of our Mooloolaba residents, businesses and visitors.

What's coming up?

Seawall

Construction of the seawall will continue to progress from a north-south approach. The seawall is expected to be completed in early February 2021, weather and site conditions permitting.

Boardwalk

The finalisation of the new boardwalk design is progressing well. Preparation works are expected to start in early December 2020 and are scheduled to be completed by mid-2021, weather and site conditions permitting.

Former amenities building

As part of Stage 1 of the Mooloolaba Foreshore Revitalisation project the former laundry/shower building must be demolished to make way for the future new public amenities and storage area.

The demolition will be carried out between mid-November and early December 2020.

What to expect during these works?

Construction hours will primarily be between 6.30am and 6pm, Monday – Friday, weather and site conditions permitting. Some Saturday works may be required between 7am and 1pm. These works will have reduced noise and truck movements.

Residents and nearby businesses should expect intermittent, low-medium level noise impacts.

Increased construction traffic entering and exiting the work area.

Some temporary changes to traffic conditions are required during these periods.

Signage and traffic controllers will be present during the works.

Reduced parking will remain available at the temporary Mooloolaba Beach car park until the opening of the new Mooloolaba 700-space multi-deck car park, scheduled to open in mid-December 2020.

To accommodate the replacement of the seawall upgrade and the new boardwalk, some existing vegetation must be removed along the foreshore. The seawall is a vital component of the project to protect the Mooloolaba foreshore, and nearby infrastructure from erosion.

Every effort will be made to minimise construction impacts where possible.
