Construction overview

To construct the new Northern Parkland community facilities, large vehicles and specialist construction machinery must be used.

On Monday 23 May and Monday 30 May, between 5am and 5pm, a large crane will be positioned in the left-hand turning lane of Mooloolaba Esplanade, opposite Venning Street.

The crane will lift the final components of the new adventure playground into position, namely the Pandanus Play towers and slides.

These works have been timed to take place outside of peak holiday periods and earlier in the week to avoid the busier days in Mooloolaba.

The playground is an outcome of community engagement from the 2015 Place Making Mooloolaba Master Plan. It is expected to be a major drawcard for the Mooloolaba precinct, help activate the northern part of the Mooloolaba Esplanade and parkland and encourage healthy and active play to benefit our community.

The full playground and Northern Parkland are set to open by the end of June 2022 (weather permitting).

About the Pandanus Play Towers

The new play towers and slides will suit children of all ages and abilities and complement the already installed new climbing net and swing set.

In designing the towers, specialist companies Place Design Group and Fleetwood Urban have drawn inspiration from the shapes and colours of nature - specifically the segmented fruit of the iconic Pandanus Tree which is native to coastal Queensland.

What to expect during these works?

State Government regulations dictate the movements of oversize vehicles on the Queensland Road network.

For safety reasons and to minimise impacts to motorists and pedestrians, the crane must be delivered to site in the early morning. Traffic control will be in operation to assist with the crane delivery and positioning, and to redirect pedestrians and motorists.

Intermittent noise can be expected, including vehicle reversing beepers and whistles used by construction workers to communicate with the crane driver in accordance with workplace health and safety regulations.

Temporary changes to traffic conditions

To safely undertake these works, approximately 50 metres of the southbound lane of Mooloolaba Esplanade, opposite the Venning Street intersection, will be temporarily closed to

motorists on 23 and 30 May. The northbound lane will remain open.

Signage and detours will be in place with normal traffic conditions resuming each evening.

The taxi rank will remain open under traffic control.

Access to the Mooloolaba Esplanade, including the Beach Terrace car park will remain open via Smith Street and First Avenue (see map for more information)

Alternative pedestrian pathways will be in place as required.
